As part of the Kingdom's Vision 2030, the further development of Makkah is a key priority for King Salman bin Abdulaziz Al Saud, the Custodian of the Two Holy Mosques and the government and people of the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia. These efforts have been guided by HRH Prince Khalid bin Faisal Al Saud – the Governor of Makkah and Advisor to the Custodian of the Two Holy Mosques. Makkah is governed by the municipality of Makkah – a municipal council of fourteen locally elected members, headed by the Mayor, HE Dr Osama bin Fadl Al Bar.

The central building of Makkah is the Kaaba, the House of God, believed to have been built by Abraham (Ibrahim) and his son Ishmael. The Kaaba is built of granite and rests on a marble base – it is Islam's holiest site and the direction for Muslim prayer. Makkah has undergone significant expansion and includes the Makkah Royal Clock Tower, which is the fourth tallest building in the world. With some 15 million Muslims visiting Makkah every year – it has become one of the most cosmopolitan cities of the Muslim world.

We at FIRST are delighted to have produced this special publication on the Holy City of Makkah and hope that it contributes, in a small way, to promoting and fostering a greater and wider understanding of the Islamic World.
